





- The property is part of the County's LAC+USC Restorative Care Village and is comprised of four parcels (2.3 acres).
- Century will present more on the proposed project at the December HICP meeting.







What is our role as the HICP?

How do we use the health equity space to elevate consciousness around anti-Blackness and promote anti-racist leadership, policies and practices?

A recap of what happened:

Leaked audio recording of a meeting between 4 very powerful Los Angeles Latinx leaders. Meeting took place over a year ago during the City of LA redistricting process.

Disturbing racist comments were made during that meeting.

Anti-Black comments. Anti-Indigenous (Oaxacan Community) comments. Homophobic comments.

Purpose and intent of the meeting was to draw council districts beneficial to the 3 council members present in that meeting.

Zero-sum game politics. In order for them to gain, others had to lose.

Accumulate "assets" for their districts at the expense of other districts losing those assets.

Attack on historically Black districts and Black political representation.

Attack on renter power and influence by ensuring renters do not become a dominant force with the support of one of the staunchest renter's rights advocates on City Council.

What has been the communities' response and what has it resulted in?

The Communities' Response:

Dozens of statements condemning the comments and calling for resignations.

Protests in City Hall, Boyle Heights, Eagle Rock.

Disruption of City Hall meetings. No business as usual until all resign.

An 18 day encampment in front of Kevin de Leon's home.

Where are things at now?

President of LA County Federation of Labor Ron Herrera - RESIGNED

City Council President Nury Martinez - RESIGNED

City Council Member Gil Cedillo - Lost reelection and term ends in December.

City Council Member Kevin de Leon - On an apology tour. Has stated he will not resign.

What we are hearing on the ground and potential opportunities:

Council Member Kevin de Leon must resign:

Accountability for his actions.

His presence in City Council is making council meetings and business an untenable situation.

Eastside organizations, leaders and residents do not want him serving as CD 14 council member.

Opportunities for Structural Reforms:

Reform the redistricting process by creating an Independent Redistricting Commission. Expand the number of City Council Districts.

Fund and Resource a City department of Racial Equity.

Necessary discussions about anti-Blackness and developing anti-racist practices:

Among our organizations and departments.

Among our staffs and members.
