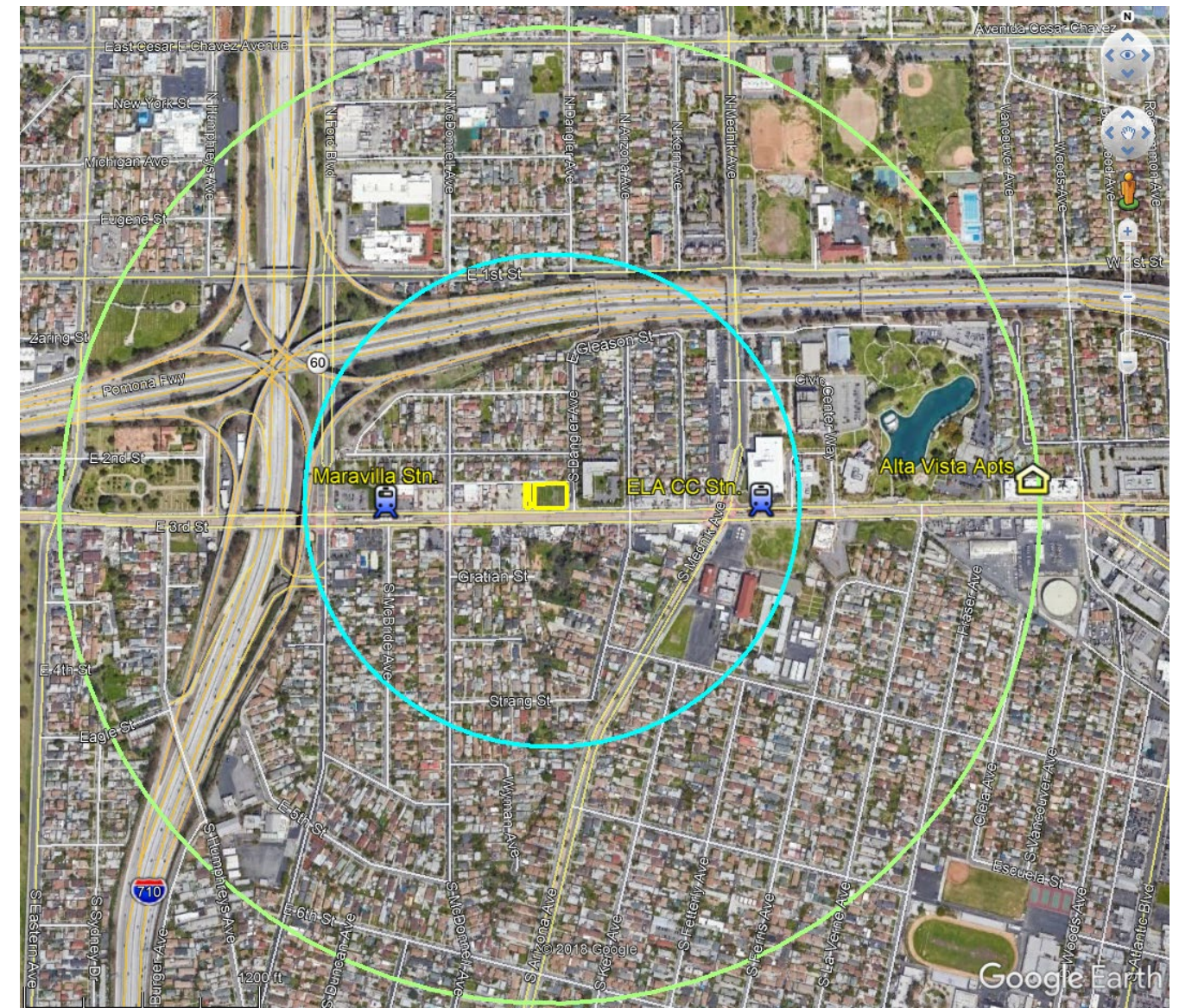

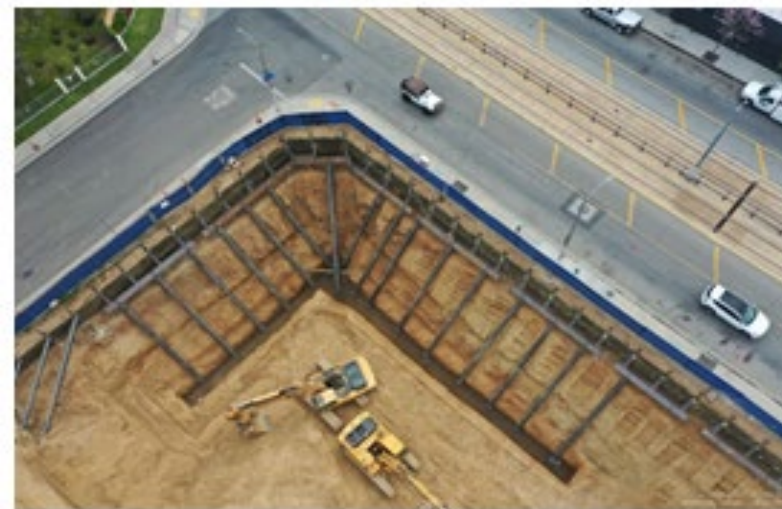

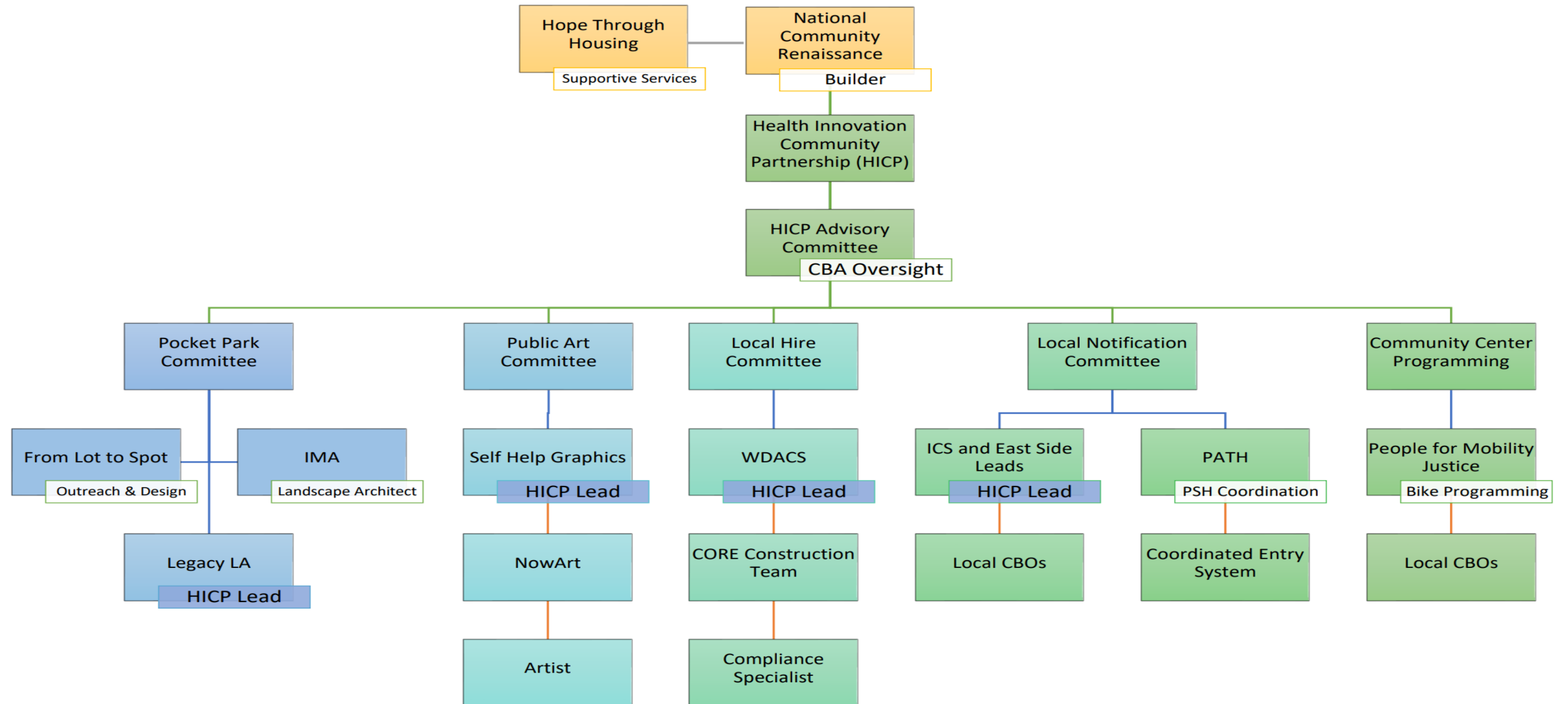


Construction Update

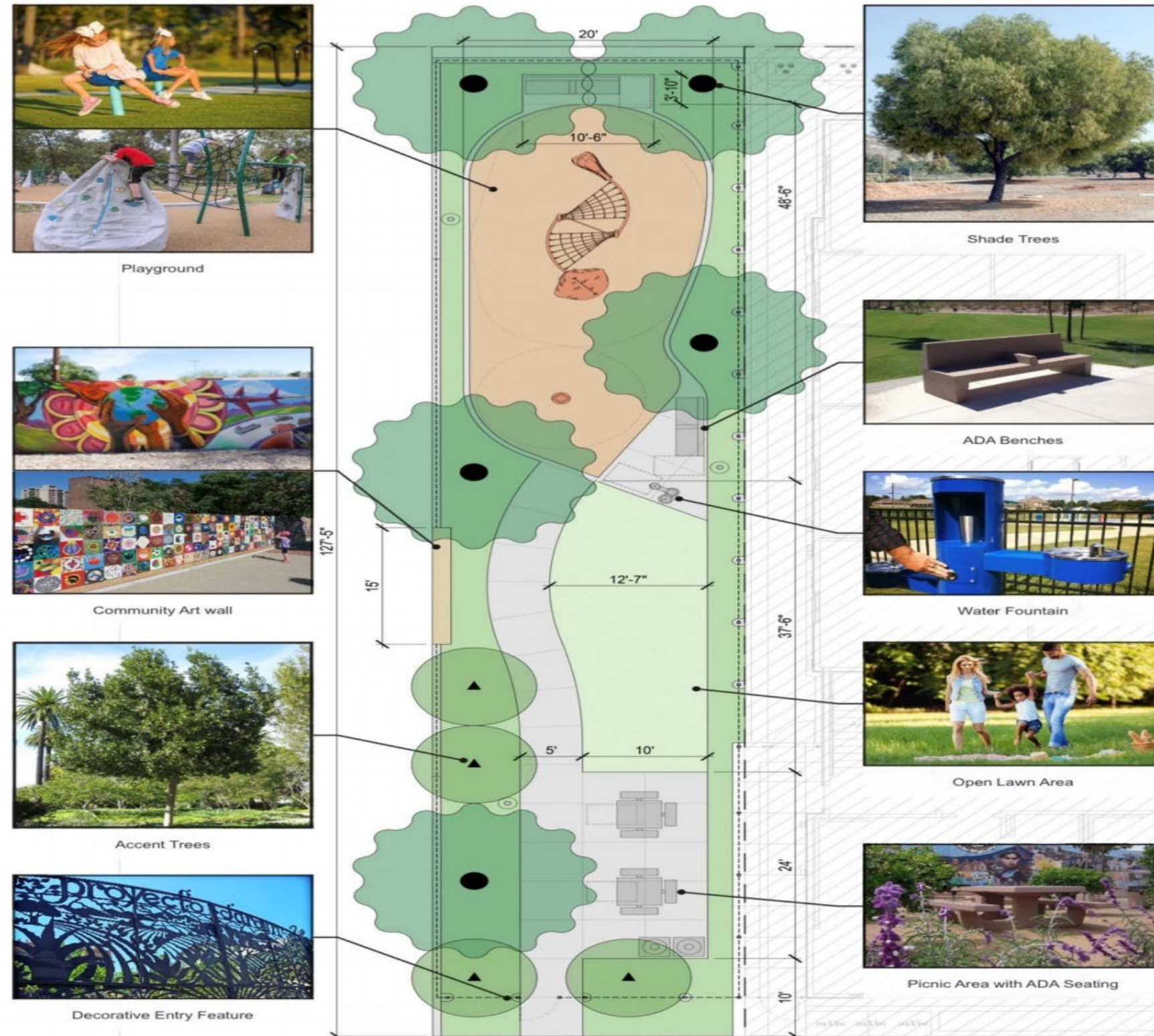

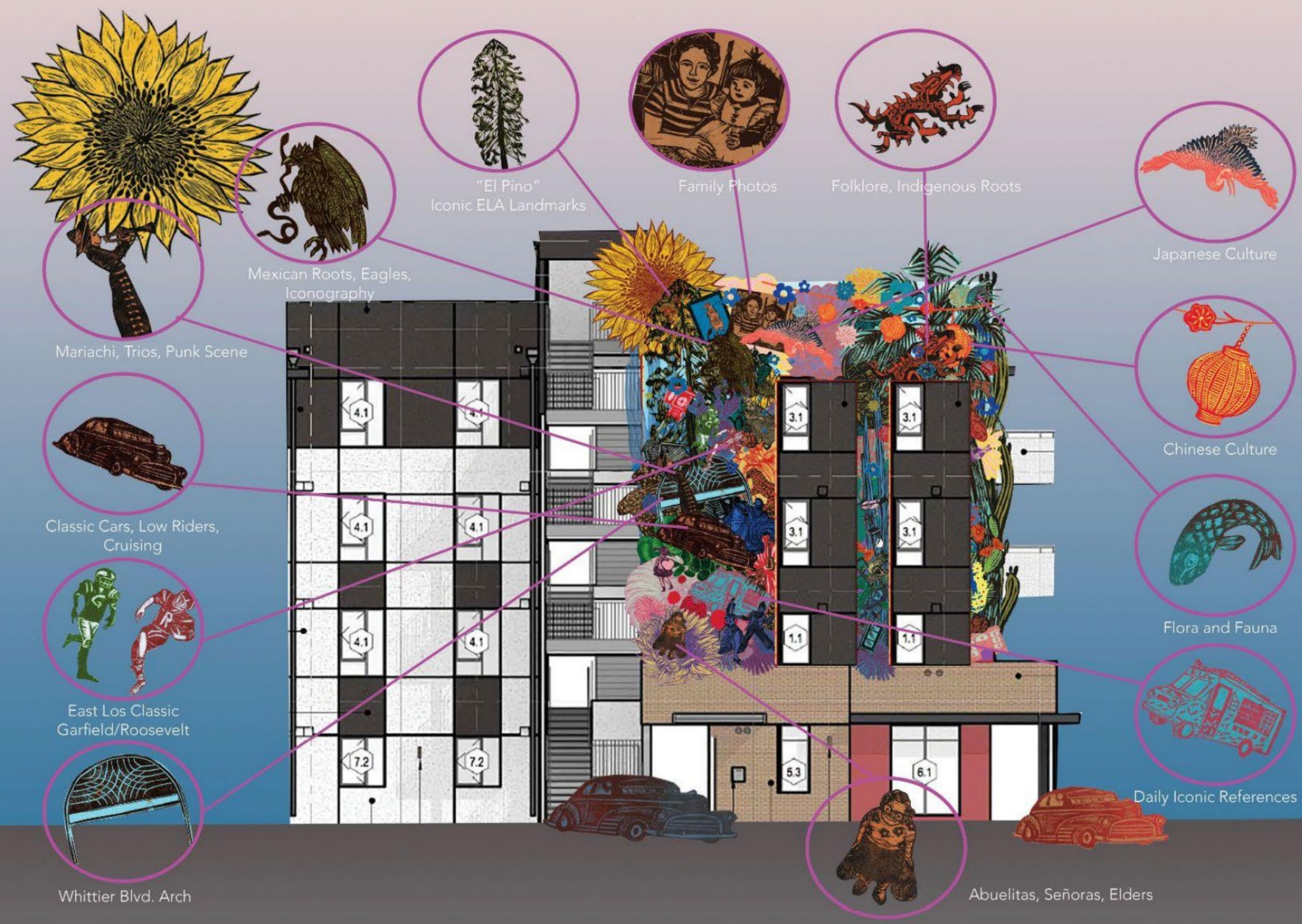

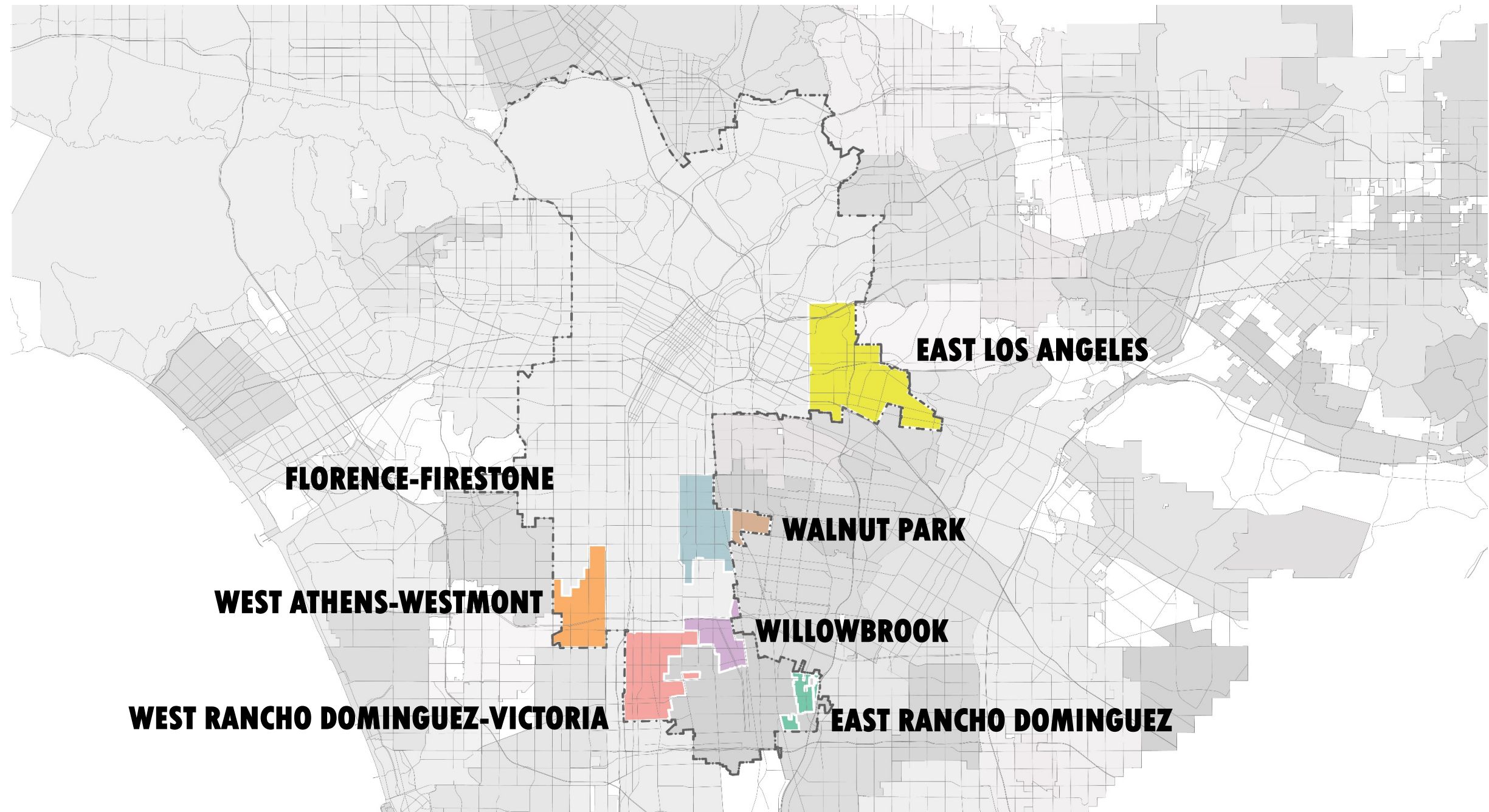

Consolidate and Update Existing Regulations

- Simplify and consolidate in one place various overlapping plans that apply to each of the communities.
- Eliminate duplication and potential regulatory conflicts

Prioritize Equity and Environmental Justice

- Recognize that MAP communities have historically been disadvantaged via past policies and decisions.

Study all Aspects of Future Housing

- Need for affordable housing
- Suitability of new housing in proximity to transit stops
- Potential residential displacement

Industrial Rezoning

- Industrial Uses are present in West Rancho Dominguez, East Los Angeles, Willowbrook, and Florence-Firestone
- Initial outreach brought up concerns with Industrial-residential adjacency
- Desire to have cleaner neighbors
- Opportunity to attract and facilitate cleaner tech and research uses



Green Alleyways

- **Successful pilot project in Willowbrook**
- **Los Angeles County Public Works Master Plan**
- **Potential benefits:** Create/activate green spaces, deter crime, help with water runoff/stormwater management



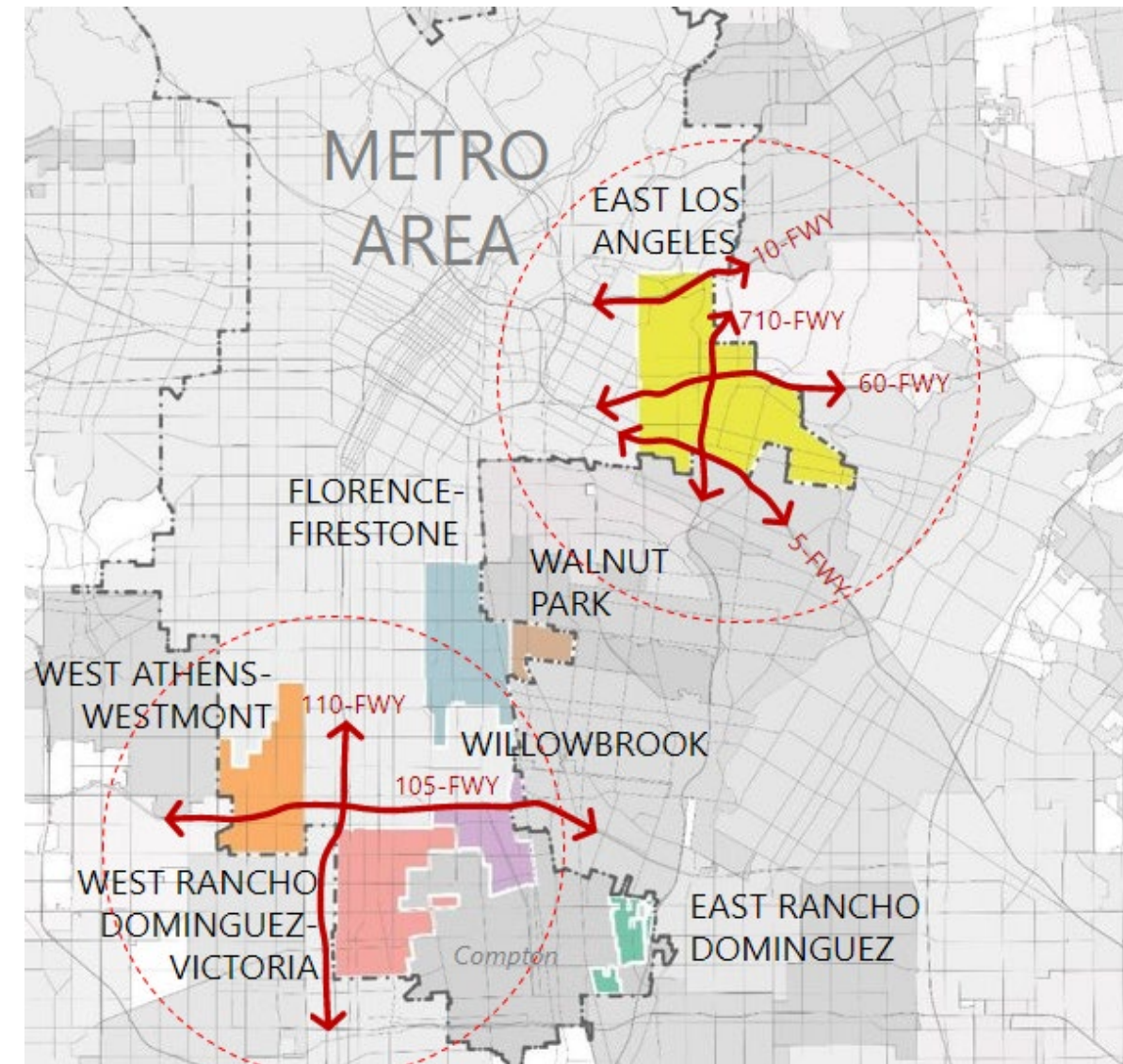
Food Trucks & Streetvending

- **Street food** is a defining characteristic, cultural identifier
- **Making it easier to sell food on the street**, while at the same time **regulating** the negative impacts: odor, encroachment, noise, and food safety.
- **Research into CA Senate Bill 972**



Freeway Caps

- **Reverse** the impact of freeways
- **Conceptual siting** for freeway caps
- **Research on similar efforts** in the greater Los Angeles metropolitan area
- **Potential funding** for feasibility studies as part of **Federal grant opportunities**

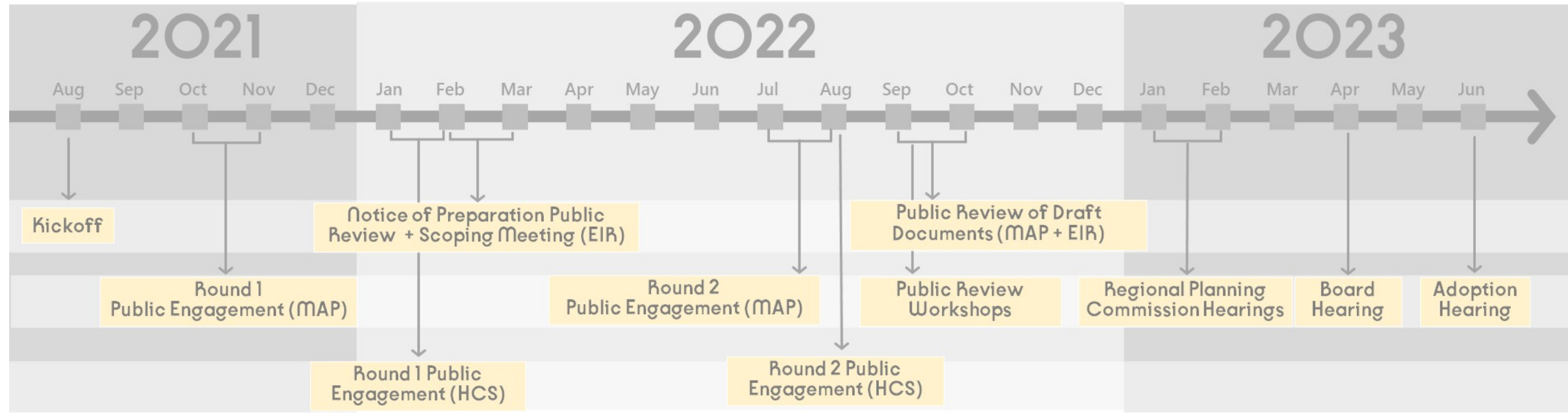

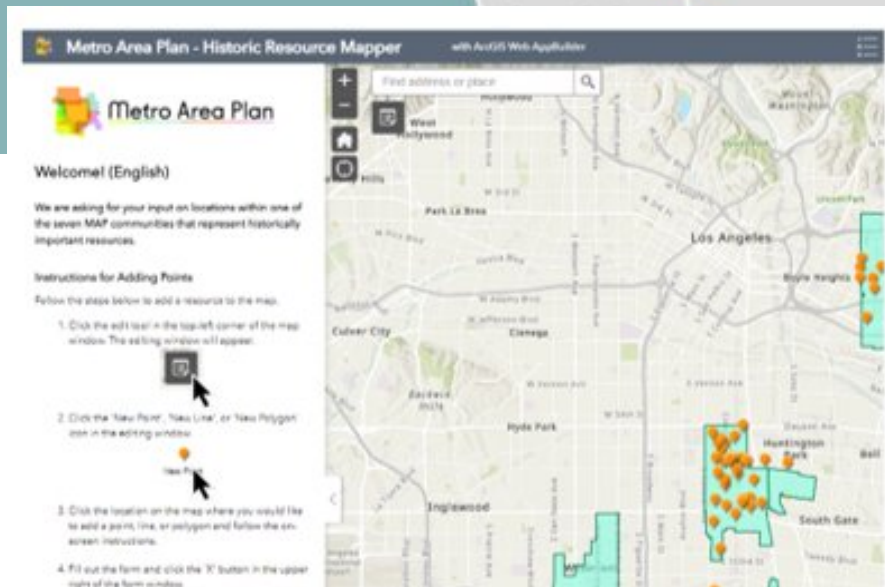

RFP Update: Responses to Questions

How much opportunity will we have to help shape the RFP?

- Community Inputs will be a central part of the RFP requirements as collected through the Community Engagement Process
- HICP will have access to the full RFP when it is made public
- We are exploring roles for HICP in the RFP development process as well as future phases

Will the RFP require local hiring goals?

- Yes. Local and Targeted Hiring Goals will be requirements in the RFP.

Will there be only one developer? is the area large enough for multiple developers?

- There will be a master agreement with a single developer,
- It is anticipated that there will be multiple subcontract agreements due to the size and complexity of the space

RFP Update: Responses to Questions

Why can't the feasibility study/RFP response be prescriptive?

- With such a large, complex site with so many variables, too much prescription would limit creativity and competition
- The RFP will include requirements, expectations and direction set by County and community priorities
- Bidders must respond to the RFP requirements and will be evaluated on their response
- Our goal is to attract multiple, qualified competitive bidders that expand the set of what is possible and allows room for negotiation

Can we leverage creativity in cost efficiency while upholding the amount of housing and types of commercial use the community is asking for?

- The RFP will leverage cost efficiencies in the private sector for costs of design, construction and financing
- This competitive leverage will enable County to assess multiple competing proposals to determine which can maximize community benefits

RFP Update: Responses to CESC Member Questions

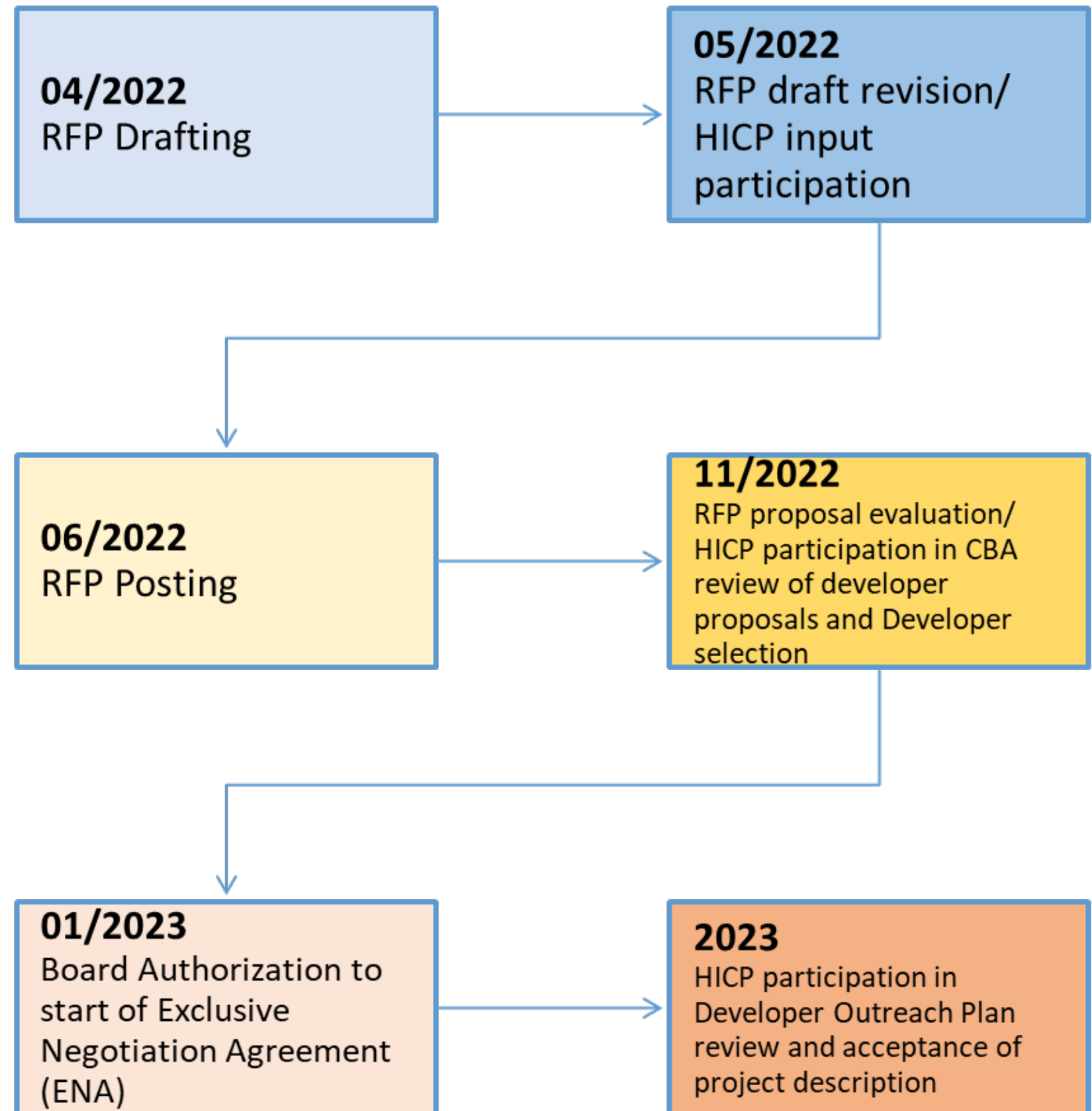
Questions have been raised about the opportunity for Community Engagement along many stages of the project, such as:

- HICP influence in Community Benefits Agreements

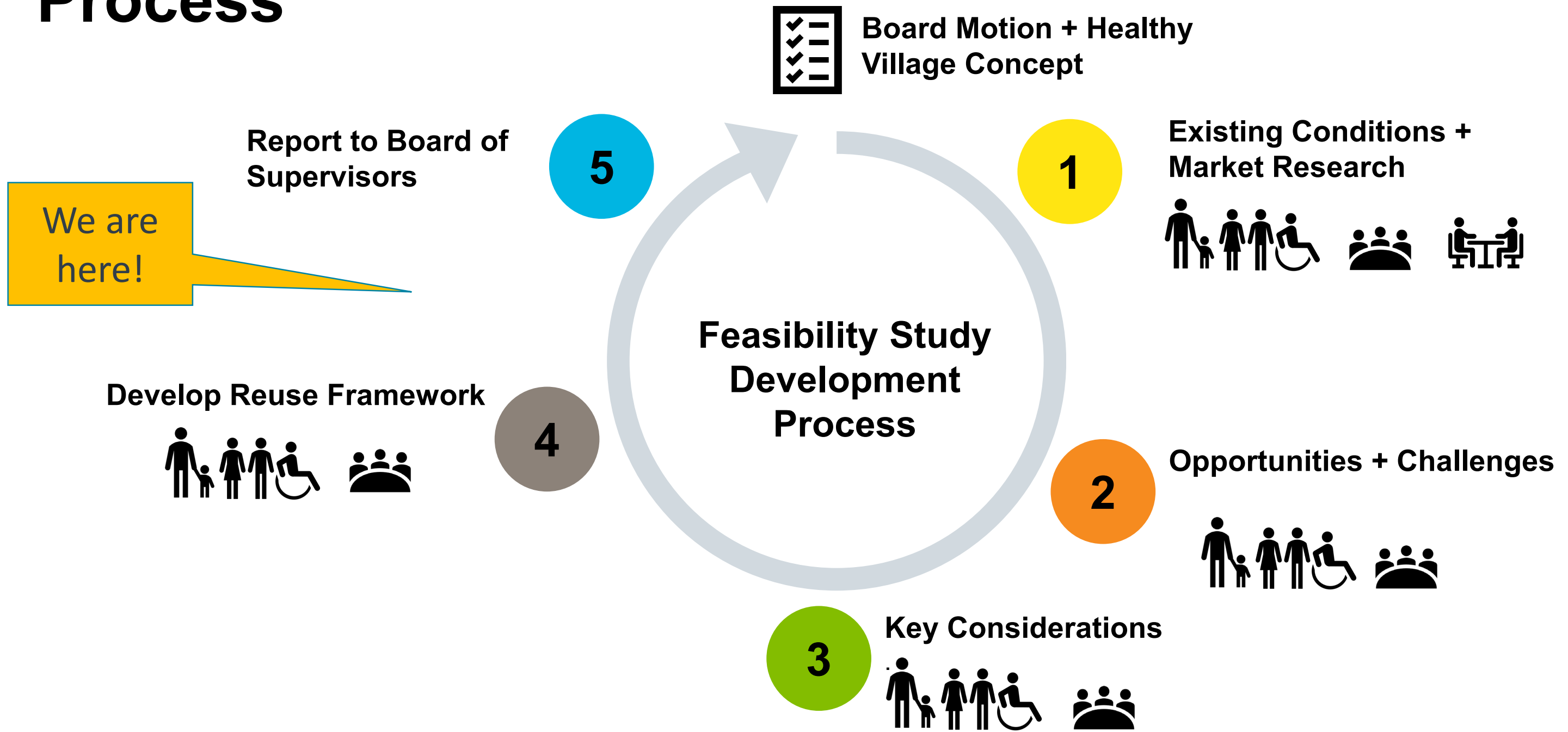
RFP Roadmap and Timeline As of 3/23/22



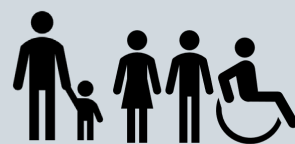

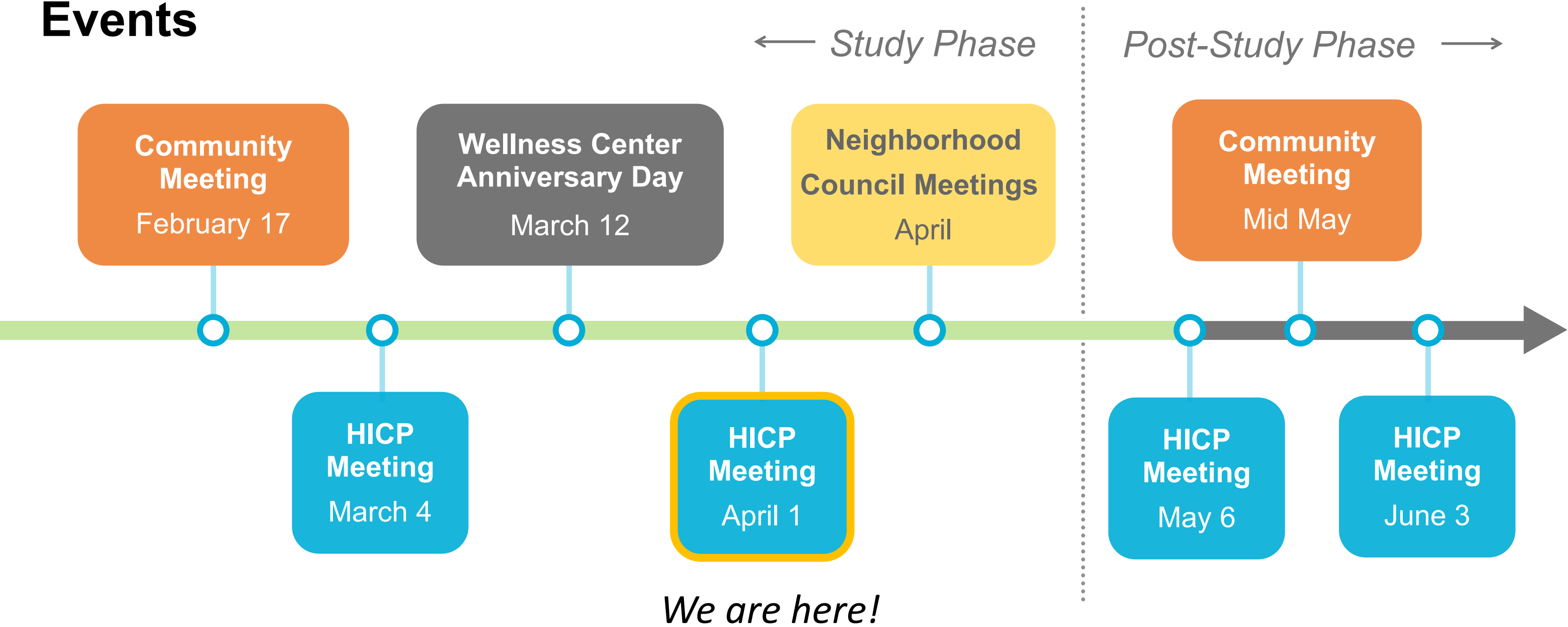
Feasibility Study Report-back

- **What does the Feasibility Study look like? What is included?**
 - Board Motion and Healthy Village Concept
 - Study Process (community input and technical analysis)
 - Existing Conditions
 - Market Research
 - Reuse Framework (key considerations from the community and County)
 - Potential Funding Sources
- **What, if anything, is closed or lost for community influence once the Feasibility Study closes?**
 - The community's priorities will be captured in the Feasibility Study, so completing the Study allows the project to move to the next phase—one step closer to providing needed community benefits
 - The process is ongoing with opportunities for community engagement and participation along the way, including with the next RFP Phase

Feasibility Study Report-back, Q&A Continued

- **What elements of the feasibility study, such as market analysis, will be shared with the community?**
 - When the Study is provided to the Board of Supervisors, it becomes a public document and therefore all components of the Study, including the market analysis, will be available to the community
- **Who ultimately decides what goes into the Feasibility Study?**
 - The community has provided input that will be documented in the Study. County partners have also provided considerations that need to be addressed. Ultimately the Supervisor's Office and the CEO will compile the final document that is presented to the Board
- **How can community visibly see their input is being taken into account? Will there be an addendum of community priorities?**
 - The Study will have a dedicated summary section and comprehensive appendix outlining the community engagement process and the uplifted community priorities and needs

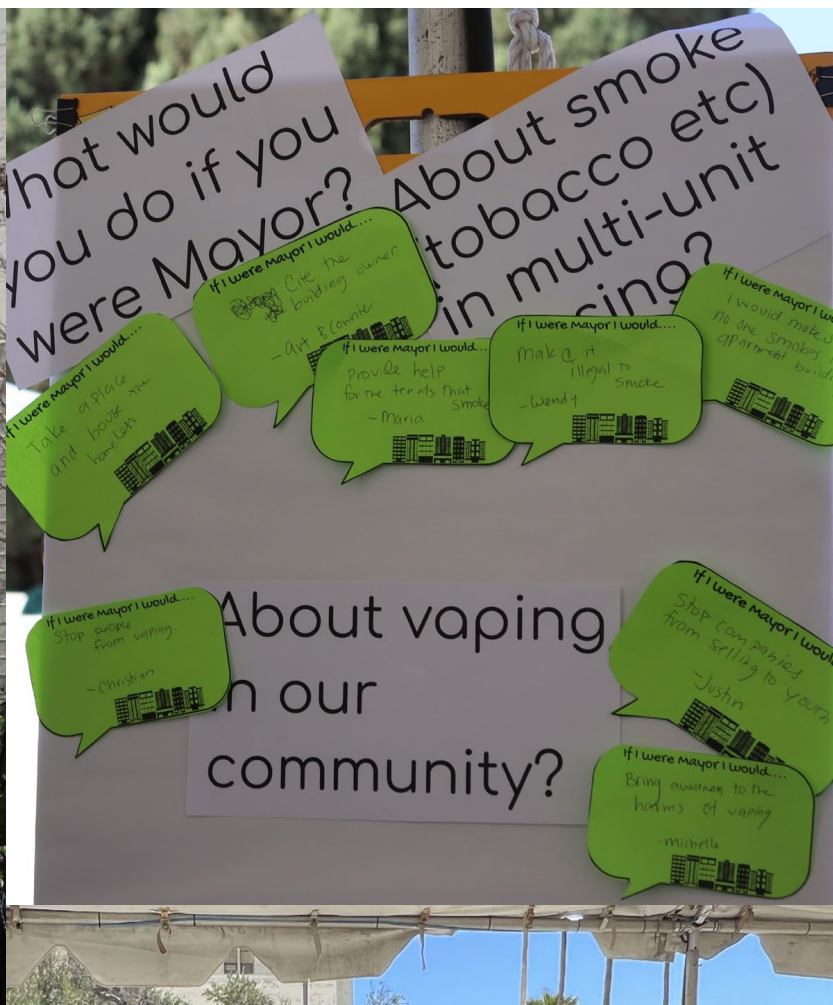
